§1 Humanity

§1a Human life is based on inviolable holiness. An act that ends a human life is a crime against all that is holy.

§1b All human beings are equally valuable regardless of gender, race, religious affiliation, or sexual orientation.

§1c Differences in salary depending on gender should be punishable by law. However, wages and occupation are based on merit and suitability, not gender or race.

§2 Family and Society

§2a The family is the fundamental unit in society. All political decisions should make it easier for families to live and work.

§2b We should actively work to make society accessible to people with disabilities and other diseases.

§2c Older people should, to a greater extent, be allowed to be cared for at home if the family so wishes. Those who care for a relative should be given financial compensation corresponding to the monthly salary they would otherwise have.

§3 Body and Sexuality

§3a Body shaming must cease. Therefore, all advertisements where faces or bodies are portrayed must contain a fair distribution of different ages and sizes.

§3b Sexual minorities should be given statutory protection.

§4 Nature

§4a Nature demands our respect and care. Animals and plants are part of creation, and man must curate this creation.

§4b In the long run, we should strive to stop consuming animal foods entirely. Before reaching this, animals used as food should be killed as painlessly as possible.

§4c Environmental protection work is one of man's foremost duties. An ecological budget should be established where the inviolable values of nature are considered before human activities occur.

§4d Animals and plants should be given natural conditions to create viable populations. Humanity should facilitate and cherish the natural habitats of plants and animals.

§5 Religion

§5a God has a natural place in our society, but faith is foremost a private matter between yourself and God.

§5b Religion and science can and must find common ground. Science without religion is lame; religion without science is blind.

§5c The Church should initiate ecumenical work to increase tolerance and religious dialogue.
